Ms Smith said four engaging workshops, offering practical and informative insights into diversity and equity in local early years settings were also part of the program.

"Attendees can take their pick from Workshops about the creative process through an art therapy lens; partnering with families of a refugee background; gender equity; and, and the value in collaborating with parents, communities and professionals to support children to thrive," she said.

"Everyone working in the early years sector is aware of the value diversity and equity adds in helping children and families feel welcome and to develop a sense of belonging."

Diversity and Equity are also a Child Safe Requirement, meaning agencies must ensure every child is supported to fully participate in their service and that any barriers to participation are consciously addressed using a strengths-based approach.

"It is hoped that this year's Conference empowers attendees to use a strength-based approach to diversity and inclusion in their settings across the Mallee region."
